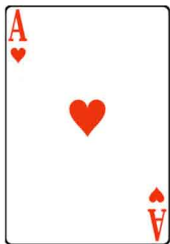

-ē

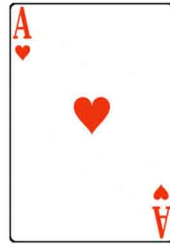


C1 W 11, 12, 23, 24 Latin Noun Endings–Plural 5th Declension

-ēbus

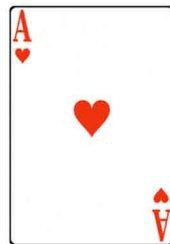
